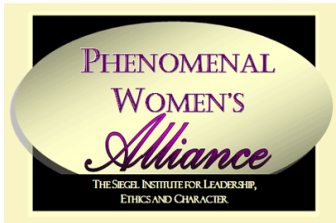
April 8 Kent "Oz" Nelson *Branding High Ethics Into Your Organization and Yourself*
